- 6. SCHEDULE
- 6.1 <u>Registration, Briefing and Boat Draw:</u> Registration & Weigh in between 1400 and 1700 Friday 2 October. First briefing & boat draw 1700 Friday 2 October.
- 6.2 <u>Dates of Racing</u>: Saturday 3 October through to Sunday 4 October.
- 6.4 Boats will be available for a practice session after crews have registered on Friday 2 October from 1430 until 1700.
- 7. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Sailing Instructions will consist of the instructions in RRS Appendix S and the Supplementary Sailing Instructions (SSI) that will be posted on the RNZYS website on Thursday I October 2020.

I3. PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded at the official prize giving to be held as soon as practical on completion of racing on Sunday 4 October 2020.

Amendment 2:

- 6.1 Registration & Weigh in between 1400 1000 and 1700 Friday 2 October 6 November.
- 6.3 <u>Number of Races</u>: up to 8 races scheduled with a maximum of 4 per day.
- 6.4 Boats will be available for a practice session after crews have registered on Friday 2 October 6 November from 1430 1000 until 1700.
- 9.3 a) once all teams have completed five (5) races, a team's series score will be the total of their race scores excluding her worst (1) score.

b) once all teams have completed eight (8) races, a team's series score will be the total of their race scores excluding her worst two (2) score.

When six (6) races have been completed, a boat's score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

9.4 If teams have raced an uneven number of races due to bye rounds, all teams' overall positions will be determined by their average score. E.g. total score / number of races sailed

I. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the 2017-2020 (RRS).
- 1.2 The Farr MRX Class Rules (handling of boats) shall apply.
- 1.3 The Yachting New Zealand Safety Regulations Part II, Category 5 shall apply.
- 1.4 On-water judging may be used for this event. World Sailing Addendum Q as amended Addendum U will apply.
- 1.5 The Regatta will be sailed in the 11 Farr MRX Yachts as provided by MRX Yachting Limited and allocated by ballot. These boats will be rigged and equipped as closely as possible to each other, to the satisfaction of the OA. Competitors shall not make any alterations to the boats and may only add or remove equipment specified in the sailing instructions.

2. ADVERTISING

2.1 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organising authority. If this rule is broken, World Sailing Regulation 20.9.2 applies. [DP]





3. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 Eligible teams may enter by completing the online entry form at <u>www.rnzys.org.nz</u> by 1700hrs Friday2 October.
- 3.2 Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the OA.
- 3.3 Up to 11 boats will be supplied, if more than 11 entries are accepted racing will take place in either seeded pools or a draw with all teams having a number of byes.
- 3.4 All skippers and crew shall be financial members of a yacht club affiliated to their National Authority.
- 3.5 Sailing crew must consist of 5 to 7 sailors and shall have a maximum weight of 525kg including the skipper. A list of confirmed crew members shall be submitted to the OA at/before registration.
- 3.6 A minimum of 6 entries are required for the winner to be recognised as National Champion by Yachting New Zealand.
- 3.7 In the event of a registered crew member (or helmsman) being unable to continue the Race Committee may authorise a substitute, a temporary substitute or other replacement.

4. FEES

4.1 The entry fee shall be NZD \$800.

5 DAMAGE DEPOSIT

- 5.1 An initial damage deposit form for NZ\$3,000 shall be confirmed at or before registration.
- 5.2 An at fault skipper(s) limit of liability in an incident is the sum of \$3,000 per boat involved in the incident.
- 5.3 In the event that a deduction from the damage deposit is decided by the OA, it will require the deposit be reinstated to its original amount before the skipper will be permitted to continue in the event.
- 5.4 Any deposit remaining after the event will be refunded within 10 days of the finish of the event.

6. SCHEDULE

- 6.1 <u>Registration, Briefing and Boat Draw:</u> Registration & Weigh in between 1400 1000 and 1700 Friday 2 October 6 November. First briefing & boat draw 1700 Friday 2 October 6 November.
- 6.2 <u>Dates of Racing</u>: Saturday 3 October 7 November through to Sunday 4 October 8 November.
- 6.3 <u>Number of Races</u>: up to 8 races scheduled with a maximum of 4 per day.
- 6.4 Boats will be available for a practice session after crews have registered on Friday 2 October 6 November from 1430 1000 until 1700.
- 6.5 Racing Schedule will be outlined in the Sailing Instructions with confirmed number of teams entered.

7. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Sailing Instructions will consist of the instructions in RRS Appendix S and the Supplementary Sailing Instructions (SSI) that will be posted on the RNZYS website on Thursday I October 5 November 2020.

8. VENUE

The intended sailing area will be the Waitemata Harbour & Northern Leading Area, or any area the Race Officer deems suitable.

9. THE COURSES

The courses shall be windward/leeward courses.

10. SCORING

- 9.1 The low point system of RRS Appendix A.
- 9.2 Five (5) races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 9.3 a) once all teams have completed five (5) races, a team's series score will be the total of their race scores excluding her worst (1) score.

b) once all teams have completed eight (8) races, a team's series score will be the total of their race scores excluding her worst two (2) score.

When six (6) races have been completed, a boat's score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

9.4 If teams have raced an uneven number of races due to bye rounds, all teams' overall positions will be determined by their average score. E.g. total score / number of races sailed

10. SUPPORT BOATS

10.1 Support boats shall be marked with the team's burgee.

10.2 Support boats must be registered with the OA at registration.

II. BERTHING

Boats shall be kept in their assigned places in Westhaven Marina.

12. RADIO COMMUNICATION

- 12.1 Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones. But does not apply to any communication over VHF channel 17.
- 12.2 The Race Committee will be contacted on VHF Channel 17.

13. PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded at the official prize giving to be held as soon as practical on completion of racing on Sunday 4 October 8 November 2020.
