SSI 18.1 Delete "Big Boats (A & Multis) 1st Line 1st, 2nd, 3rd PHRF 1st, 2nd PHS". After "Passage Division Non-Spinnaker" delete "1st Line" and "2nd, 3rd" (on PHS)

Attachment B - SATURDAY & SUNDAY HARBOUR COURSES, in Course 3 description, "after Rangitoto #13 (", replace "S" with "P".

SSII

- The Yachting New Zealand Safety Regulations of Sailing 2021-2024
 - a. Part II Category 5 including any amendments to the Safety Regulations will apply to all keelboats & multihulls.
 - b. Part V, Category B including any amendments to the Safety Regulations that are issued will apply to all Elliott 7's, trailer yachts & sports trailer yachts.
 - c. Part VII including any amendments to the Safety Regulations that are issued will apply to all Sports multihulls racing in Division M.
- 1.2 The NZ Sports Boat Association rules, regulations and by-laws shall apply to all boats racing in the Sports Boat Division.
- 1.3 Rule 51 Movable Ballast is changed so that boats shall be nominated with "non moveable ballast" or with "A Canting Keel" or "Water Ballast Tanks". A boat nominated with non moveable ballast and a boat with a lifting keel shall comply with Rule 51 as written in the Racing Rules of Sailing 2021 - 2024. Lifting Keels shall be locked in the down position and may not be moved whilst racing. Rules 51 & 52 are modified to allow boats with movable/variable ballast systems to compete. Boats must comply with World Sailing Addendum K (www.sailing.org) and Yachting New Zealand Safety Regulations revised clauses 6.3 (K) and 6.4 (K) (www.yachtingnz.org.nz).
- 1.4 Rule 52 Manual Power shall not apply.

Notices to competitors will be posted on the Auckland Regatta website (www.aucklandregatta.co.nz) and also on the official notice board located in the Western Entrance foyer at the RNZYS Clubrooms and on the official notice boards located at the BBYC Clubhouse.

SSI 3 Signals made ashore will be displayed on the BBYC Flagstaff and on the Main Flagpole at the RNZYS.

COURSES (SI 7)

SSI 6

- 6.1 The course area will be in the vicinity of the Northern Leading marker.
- Attachments; A for Windward Leewards, B for Harbour and C for Passage racing show the outline of the courses, the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.
- 6.3 Attachment C Passage Race Course will be published on the 24th March.
- 6.4 No later than the warning signal, the race committee signal boat may display the approximate compass bearing of the first leg.

MARKS (SI 8)

SSI 7 The marks are as described in Attachments A, B & C of these SSI and published online.

THE START (SI 9)

- **SSI 8** When a starting sequence is in progress, boats whose warning signal has not been made, shall avoid the starting area. The starting area is defined as the area 50 metres from the starting line and marks in all directions.
- **SSI 9** A boat starting later than four minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes RRS A4.1
- **SSI 10** Individual Recalls in addition to RRS rule 29.1, the race committee may call yachts on the VHF channel 17.

PENALTY SYSTEM (SI 13)

SSI 13 Where a boat has broken a rule in Part 2 of the RRS or RRS rule 31, only one turn, including one gybe and one tack, is required. This changes RRS rules 44.1 and 44.2.

PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS (SII3)

SSI 14

- 14.1 Immediately after finishing a boat intending to protest shall, in addition to the requirements of Rule 61.1(a), inform the race committee boat at the finishing line of her intention to protest and the identity of the boat(s) protested against. The protesting boat must receive an acknowledgement from the race committee. This changes Rule 61.
- 14.2 Protest forms are available at the BBYC & RNZYS Race offices.
- 14.3 Notices will be posted no later than 15 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held in the protest room at RNZYS on Saturday and Sunday.
- 14.4 Protests will start approximately 15 minutes after the protest time limit has expired. If a boat involved in a protest is not present at this time, the protest may be heard without that boat attending.

SCORING

SSI 15

- 15.1 Positions will be calculated using PHRF, and PHS (General Handicap). PHS may be adjusted for each race.
- 15.2 PHRF positions for a division will only be calculated if there are three or more boats in that division with current PHRF certificates.
- 15.3 For All Divisions
 - (a) No score will be excluded until six (6) races have been completed and then a boat's worst (1) score will be excluded.

SAFETY REGULATIONS

SSI 16

- 16.1 A boat that retires from a race shall notify the Race Committee as soon as possible on VHF Channel 17.
- 16.2 Any boat or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with safety requirements, rating certificates and/or Sailing Instructions.

RADIO COMMUNICATION

SSI 17 Radio communication may be made to the Race Committee on VHF Channel 17.

- 19.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS rule 4, Decision to Race. The Organising Authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta. Owners shall accept full responsibility for the sea worthiness and safe navigation of their boats and the competence of their crews.
- 19.2 As all owners are aware competitive racing inevitably carries with it an increased risk of collision between boats and resultant damage and expense. The Organising Authority urges all owners to carry full racing insurance and believes that at the very least third party insurance should be held. It is not, however the responsibility of the Organising Authority to police or enforce insurance; it is a matter of choice for individual owners and skippers. The Organising Authority will not be responsible for losses arising during the regatta (insured or otherwise). All owners and skippers are advised that it is the responsibility of owners and/or skippers to ensure that they carry the relevant insurance. Boats race at their own risk.

Course 2: Start to II – Ial – Gate 2s / 2p (if laid) – II – Ial– Finish

The course number will be a numeral pennant displayed on the Race Committee Boat.

B1.3 All Rounding Marks to Port except at the Gate. Boats shall sail between Mark 2p and the Gate Mark 2s from the direction of the previous mark.



CHANGE OF COURSE:

For a change of course, a single GREEN buoy will be used to replace Mark 1 for Div A & B, and a single BLACK buoy will be used to replace Mark 1 for Div S & C.









ATTACHMENT B SATURDAY & SUNDAY HARBOUR COURSES:

The course number will be a numeral pennant displayed on the Race Committee Boat. All divisions will start in the general area of your division windward leeward courses. If laid the windward top mark (mark I of the W/L course) will be either taken to Port or Starboard indicated by a Red (port) or Green (stbd) flag on the side of the committee boat. If no flag is flown then the windward mark I is NOT a mark of the course, this will be advised over the VHF.

The Finish will be between the Westhaven tower and the yellow Westhaven ODM

- 2. The Commercial Harbour area defined by straight line drawn between the most northern point of Wynyard Point and the north western point of the Fergusson Terminal.
- 3. The Defence Area marked on the Chart NZ 5322 around the Naval Dock, Calliope Wharves, Devonport
