



YNZ Safety Regulations of Sailing 2013 - 2016 Category 4 regulations

- 13.13 Bilge pump. A size and capacity commensurate with the type of boat.
 - 13.14 (b) One Manual bilge pump.
 - 13.17 Each bilge pump handle shall be provided with a lanyard
 - 13.19 Two buckets each of at least 9 litres . Each bucket is to have a lanyard
 - 15.11 Tools and spare parts including adequate means to disconnect standing rigging.
 - 15.19 A suitable sail repair kit.
 - 16.03 Toilet , securely installed or fitted bucket.
 - 16.09 Gass appliances .Installed to comply with the current code.
TURN OFF GAS AT BOTTLE. Notice 75mm x 150mm
 - 16.15 Suitable containers for water.
 - 16.18 Yachts name or personal identification on lifejackets , harnesses, and lifebuoys.
 - 16.19 LPG lockers shall be used only for the purpose of housing gas equipment
and shall me marked accordingly.
 - 17.02 Fire extinguishers at least 2 . Total weight if dry powder 4kgs
 - 17.03 Fire extinguishers shall be serviced / tested / replaced as required.
 - 17.05 Lifejackets , one for each crew 150n
The name of the yacht or owner
NZS5823:2005 Type 402 or its equivalent
Must supply 71n of buoyancy.
 - 17.06 Whistles without peas attached to the lifejacket
All lifejackets must be fitted with marine retro-reflective tape.
 - 17.08 Harnesses
17.08(b) 50% of the crew must be equipped
 - 17.12 17.12© Where the dinghy or raft is carried on deck , it shall be secured in a substantial
manner to fittings which are through bolted.
17.12(b) In all cases dinghies or rafts must be of a size so as to be able to carry the
whole crew as specified by the manufacturer and be marked with the vessel's name.
 - 17.13 Lifebuoys and Dan buoys
1 suitably marked with the yacht's name and equipped with
a drogue, pealess whiste and self-igniting light.
 - 17.14 Heaving line 16m minimum lengthe, 6mm minimum diameter. With a floating weight
 - 17.15 Emergency knife
 - 17.18 Lifelines
 - 17.2 Stauchions
 - 17.21(k) Overlapping pulpits
 - 17.22(k) Pulpit and stauchion fixing.
 - 17.29 Anchors .1 complete with tackle . 40m tackle
 - 17.3 Anchors and any chain shall be securely fastened in position when not in use
 - 17.34(m) Grab bag SR Appendix 2 . To be packed on a floating container with lanyard
 - 17.35 First Aid
 - 18.2(ii)(k) Handheld waterproof marine multichannel VHF radio.
 - 18.3 Radio receiver capable of receiving weather bulletins
 - 18.7 Flares
1 red parachute flare or very pistol and eight cartridges
2 red hand flares or laser flare
1 white hand flare or spotlight minnum 500,000 candle power
1 orange smoke day signal
Flares must not be more than 3 years old as indicated by the expiry date.
 - 18.8 Flashlights. 2 flashlights 1 of which is floating , suitable for signalling , waterproof
with spare batteries and bulbs
 - 19 Navigation
 - 19.01 Compass
 - 19.03 Local tide tables
Marine charts of area to be sailed
Plotting equipment , dividers
Operating instructions & manuals for the navigation aids carried.
 - 19.04 Depth Sounder
 - 19.07 Navigation lights
 - 19.09 Foghorn
 - 21 Skipper and Crew
 - 22 Sail number and Name
Yachts shall clearly display in legible characters of 50mm but preferably 100mm
their registered name on the hull and YNZ sail number on the mainsail.
