1 RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 The Yachting New Zealand Safety Regulations shall apply as follows:
 - a) Part II Category 5 shall apply for keel boats (except Young 88) and multihulls,
 - b) Part II Category 4 shall apply for Young 88 boats,
 - c) Part V Category B shall apply for trailer yachts,
 - d) Part VI Category B shall apply for sports boats,
 - e) Part VII shall apply for sport multihulls.

- 1.3 RRS 52, Manual Power shall not apply.
- 1.4 For Division E, *Non-Spinnaker* No Spinnakers or extras may be set. Extras are defined as sails normally not used to advantage to windward. Headsails may be boomed out using spinnaker poles but shall only be carried on a permanent load bearing forestay with only one headsail per forestay.
- 1.5 Appendix T, Arbitration will apply.

2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 2.1 The Sailing Instructions will consist of the instructions in the RNZYS Standard Sailing Instructions, and the Supplementary Sailing Instructions.
- 2.2 The RNZYS Standard Sailing Instructions are posted on the RNZYS website at www.rnzys.org.nz.
- 2.3 The Supplementary Sailing Instructions will be posted on the RNZYS website at www.rnzys.org.nz by 18:00 on Wednesday 10th May 2023.

3 COMMUNICATION

- 3.1 The online official notice board is located at www.rnzys.org.nz
- 3.2 [DP] All boats shall maintain a listening watch on VHF channels 16 & 17.
 - (a) Channel 17 is to be used for race event communication.
 - (b) Channel 16 must be used for emergency communication.
- In an emergency, the boat in distress must request assistance via VHF channel 16 for the Coastguard and Emergency Services to be alerted.
- 3.4 [DP] While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1 The Doyle Sails Winter Series is an open event, open to members of any yacht club.
- 4.2 Classes are defined as follows:

- 4.3 Eligible boats may enter by;
 - (a) Completing the on-line entry form on the club website, www.rnzys.org.nz
 - go to **Sailing**, then **Club Racing**, select **Doyle Sails Winter Series** and click on **Entry Form**, and
 - (b) Paying the non-refundable entry fee prior to racing.
- 4.4 To be considered a valid Boat Membership entry in the event, a boat shall complete all Boat Membership registration requirements and pay all fees by Saturday 13th May 2023.
- 4.5 To be considered a valid series entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees by Saturday 13th May 2023.
- 4.6 To be considered a valid casual entry in an individual race, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees by 5pm on the Friday prior to the race.
- 4.7 Boats wishing to sail under PHRF handicap must ensure that they have selected this on their entry and supplied the PHRF Registration Number from their current PHRF Certificate to the Race Office.





- 4.8 If fewer than 5 boats are entered in a division, the race committee may place those boats in another division or combine two or more divisions into a separate division
- 4.9 Final allocation of boats to each division will be made by the Handicap Committee.

5 FEES

5.3 Late series and casual entries shall be subject to an additional Late Entry Fee as per SSI 5.2.

6 CLASSIFICATION

6.1 There are no classification requirements in accordance with RRS 79.

7 ADVERTISING AND IDENTIFICATION

7.1 [DP] Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority in accordance with World Sailing Regulation 20.

8 SCHEDULE

All Divisions Except Classic Yachts,

8.1 The scheduled dates for racing for all divisions except Classic yachts are:

8.3 The scheduled dates for racing for the Classic yachts (Division K) are:

- 8.4 The scheduled time for the first warning signal for Division K will be 12:25.
- 8.5 The individual start times for each division will be listed in the SSI's.

9 **EQUIPMENT INSPECTION**

9.1 Spot measurement and safety checks may be conducted at any time during the event.

10 **VENUE**

10.1 The racing will be held on the Waitemata Harbour and inner Hauraki Gulf.

11 THE COURSES

11.1 The courses to be sailed may be a mix of windward leeward courses (normally based in the Northern Leading Area) and described in the SSI, and harbour courses as listed online in Addendum A – HARBOUR COURSES under RACE DOCUMENTS AND COURSES 2022 – 2023 on the club website – www.rnzys.org.nz, and in the RNZYS handbook.

If there is a difference between the course online and the course printed in the handbook, the online version of the course will take precedence.

The R div, A div, MRX div, Sportsboat div and Elliott 7 divisions will sail W/L races on race days 3, 6 and 9. They will sail harbour courses on all other race days.

All other divisions will sail harbour races on all race days.

11.3 Those divisions that are scheduled to sail Harbour courses and those divisions scheduled to sail W/L courses on each race day will be listed in detail in the SSI's.

12 **SCORING**

- Only series entrants will be eligible for series scores. Casual race entrants are eligible for daily race prizes but will not be included in series race scores. This changes RRS A2.2.
- 12.2 One (I) race is required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 12.3 Each days W/L racing will be scored as a mini-series for that day, and a boat's overall placing for that day will be entered into the Winter Series scoring as their race score for that day's racing, ie. even though a boat may complete 3 or 4 W/L races on one day they will only receive 1 race score for that day in the Winter Series overall results.
- 12.4 For all divisions except Classic yachts,
 - (a) When from 1 to 7 fewer than 6 race days have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores,
 - (b) When from 8 to 9 6 to 8 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score,
 - (c) When 10 9 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.





- 12.5 For the Classic yachts division,
 - (a) When from I to 4 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores,
 - (b) When from 5 to 6 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score,
 - (c) When 7 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.
- 12.6 RRS 90.3 (e) applies.
- 12.7 RRS A5.3 applies.

13 SUPPORT BOATS

- 13.1 [DP] All support and coach boats must have VHF communications and be available to assist the race committee if required.
- 13.2 [DP] All support and coach boats shall have an engine safety cut out switch (kill cord) attached to the driver at all times while the engine is running unless prior written exemption has been provided by the Organising Authority.

14 RIGHTS TO USE NAME AND LIKENESS

- By participating in this event, competitors automatically grant to the Organising Authority and the event sponsors the right, in perpetuity, to make, use, and show, at their discretion, any photography, audio and video recordings, and other reproductions of them made at the venue or on the water from the time of their arrival at the venue, until their final departure, without compensation.
- 14.2 All those who take part in this event as competitors as well as support crew or spectators agree to be overflown by a drone during the duration of the event, this includes your person and your property (boats).

15 RISK STATEMENT

RRS 3 states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone." By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia, or other causes.

16 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

All those taking part in RNZYS races or any other sailing events controlled by the RNZYS, as between the RNZYS and each of those so taking part, do so at their own risk and responsibility and the RNZYS and any sponsor associated with this event has no liability for any damage, loss or any penalty suffered by any boat crew or any other person taking part in such events. The RNZYS and any sponsor associated with this event shall not be responsible for the seaworthiness of a boat whose entry is accepted and/or the sufficiency and/or adequacy of its equipment or the competence of its skipper or crew. The RNZYS reserves the right in its sole and uncontrolled discretion to refuse entry

17 INSURANCE





Each participating boat shall be insured with valid marine third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$5,000,000 per incident or the equivalent.

18 PRIZES

- 18.1 Daily prizes will be presented in the RNZYS clubrooms after racing on the day of racing.
 - (a) prizes will be presented for line honours and for first, second and third on general handicap in each division except the MRX division,
 - (b) prizes will be presented for first, second and third on line for the MRX division.
- For a first-place prize to be awarded, three (3) yachts must start the race in that division. For a second-place prize to be awarded, five (5) yachts must start the race in that division. For a third-place prize to be awarded, eight (8) yachts must start the race in that division.
- 18.3 Daily handicap prizes may be collected from reception on or after the Monday following the prize giving.
- 18.4 Line honour prizes can only be collected at that day's prizegiving.
- Series prizes will be awarded at the series prize giving in the RNZYS clubrooms after racing on Saturday 16th September 2023.
 - (a) prizes will be presented for line honours and for first, second and third on general handicap in each division, except R division,
 - (b) prizes will be presented for line honours and for first, second and third on PHRF for R division.
- 18.6 For a first-place series prize to be awarded, three (3) yachts must enter the series in that division.

For a second-place series prize to be awarded, five (5) yachts must enter the series in that division.

For a third-place series prize to be awarded, eight (8) yachts must enter the series in that division.

18.7 Series Plaques will be awarded for line honours and first, second and third overall on general handicap and PHRF (if applicable) in each division. These may be collected at the Winter Series Prizegiving on Saturday 16th September 2023.
